A Holly Jolly Christmas

Released by Decca Records in October 1965, "A Holly Jolly Christmas" was written by Johnny Marks in 1962. It featured in The Quinto Sisters' debut album, "Holly Jolly Christmas," recorded for Columbia Records in June 1964, with Al Caiola on guitar and arrangements by Frank Hunter and Marty Manning.

The song gained fame through Burl Ives.

Main chorus to help you sing it in your head or out loud!

Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree

"Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree," a jolly Christmas tune also written by Johnny Marks, gained popularity with Brenda Lee's 1958 spirited rendition.
